

## Pupil Premium Grant

Pupil Premium Grant is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals, have been entitled to it in the last six years or service personnel pupils in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. In line with government guidance, this money is used to support pupils from low income families at Aston St Mary's Church of England Primary School.

The school received £11440 for 2017/18, but spends additionally to ensure good progress, the wellbeing of our pupils and equal opportunities for all. The money is spent to address the individual needs of each pupil entitled to this funding. As in 2016/17, this year we will spend the money as previously:

- One-to-one tuition for pupils entitled to Pupil Premium £4500
- Support with funding for extra curriculum activities to develop the whole child. This includes music lessons, residential and school trips and additional professional sports coaching £2700
- Through extended termly pupil progress meetings, the planning and evaluating of impact of specific interventions £900+
- The deployment of an HLTA/LSA with specific responsibilities for the emotional wellbeing of pupils, working with the whole class and targeted individuals to ensure all pupils are ready to learn and therefore make progress £4750+
- The purchase of resources for pupils to use at home to support their progress £350

For 2017/18 the school will also invest Pupil Premium money by employing a Higher Learning Teaching Assistant (HLTA) to support our disadvantaged pupils during whole class, small groups, lead interventions and work on a one-to-one basis with the pupils. This was continued due to the success the previous academic year.

All interventions are rigorously monitored and evaluated by the Senior Leadership Team to ensure impact is positive on an on-going basis to ensure good progress for all Pupil Premium pupils and good value for money.

## Evaluation

Pupil Premium money supports our disadvantaged pupils and accelerates their progress. The grant is used to focus on supporting the whole child and provides them with opportunities equal to their peers. However, the main focus is on raising their attainment to ensure they achieve as well as their peers or exceed them. Examples of additional support includes music lessons and professional sports coaching. All pupil premium pupils and their families are supported by the school. When required the SLT meet with the parents and discuss ways we could use their funding to support their child. This has resulted in school trips being funded, including residential trips. We have also supported an Ever 6 family (who no longer receive FSM) with purchasing school dinners for their children to encourage healthy eating and social interaction with peers.

The 2013 and 2014 results indicated that the attainment of our PPG pupils at the end of KS2 all pupils had achieved at least the national expected level 4 in reading, writing and mathematics, plus achieved at least two levels progress. In 2013 this made us one of only 153 schools in England who achieved this high standard. Although the PPG pupils were not completely in line with their peers they had made at least expected progress and attainment, with some exceeded.
