

## PE and Sports Premium

To improve PE provision and sport in schools the government has allocated money to all primary schools. The money is ring-fenced for PE and sport, however schools are free to choose how they spend their allocation. We received £13487 for 2017/18 academic year. The table below shows how we spend our funding on PE provision at Aston St Mary's CoE (VA) Primary School.

Details	Cost	Impact
Football coaching Y1 upwards	£1240	Pupils requested football club from Y1 upwards. Girls and boys attend the club. 37% of eligible pupils attend. Raised attainment.
Football league for small schools	£60	Pupils experience competitive sports
Staff development – including FA coaching badge	£200	Pupils are receiving professional football coaching, following England's FA guidance
Resources to deliver high quality PE provision and PE equipment safety checks. Including: footballs, training resources, new football kits, netballs, new kits	£950+	The school is well resourced to deliver high quality PE provision. Sporting resources are lent out to other schools. Equipment is safe for participation. Raised attainment.
Athletics club and Inter-Village Athletics Competition (Summer term)	£700	All pupils invited to attend after school athletics club. We expect 40% of our pupils to attend. Raised attainment.
PE Fun Days (one per term)	£660	100% of pupils experience fun sporting activities, which encourage pupils to participate in sports for enjoyment and to lead a healthy lifestyle
New netball court and physical games on newly surfaced playground	£2532	The school will have a netball team and hope to play competitive games against other schools. Fun games will encourage pupils to play games during free time which increase heart rate and fitness
Qualified sports coaches to train and develop our pupils in competitive and non-competitive sports. Coaches work with our teachers to improve the teaching and learning of PE across the school	£8500+	Increased pupils' participation in sporting activities through offering exciting extra activities during and after school. Teachers have improved their skills at teaching PE, which is supporting pupils' progress in PE. Raised attainment.

Non-contact time for class teachers to support events	£180 X 4 = £720.00	Pupils accessing competitive events and experiencing a variety of sporting events, which will raise their attainment.
Non-contact time for subject leader	£180 X 3 - £540	High quality leadership to ensure outstanding PE provision is provided for all pupils, raising whole school attainment.

Additional impact of the Sports Funding includes: More involvement in the community sporting events, football leagues and tournaments, athletes and VIPs visiting the school. People from the community are invited to attend and celebrate some events in school.

Money spent within learning resources budget, CPD, additional hours for LSAs and E27 professional services curriculum area.

### **How will improvements be sustained in the future?**

Teachers will have the knowledge and experience to lead high quality PE provision. Resources will be available to compliment the teaching and learning. Staff will nurture pupils and encourage them to have a positive attitude to PE and keeping healthy, supporting them to lead a healthy lifestyle.

We aim to raise pupils' enjoyment and attainment in PE, which encourages them to participate in physical exercise out of school and as they move onto their next stage in education– e.g join sports teams, make new friends and to build self-esteem.
