Despite being a long half term, it seems to have flown past with lots going on in school. The children have now settled into their new classes and it is wonderful to see the amount of learning that has happened already. We hope that you are enjoying our new class updates on the newsletters; these enable us to share just a few of the fantastic learning experiences that our children enjoy in school.

Last week, saw the PTFA AGM – thank you to all those who attended. We are a small school with a limited budget, without the hard work of our PTFA we simply wouldn't be able to offer our children many of the opportunities that they currently enjoy. For example, we now have 30 new ipads and 30 new laptops enabling all of our children to have access to this technology for two days every week – this is well beyond the resources offered in many other schools and was part-funded by our PTFA. The PTFA also enabled us to purchase around 1,000 new reading books last year. These have re-stocked our library and class book corners as well as updating our reading scheme for our younger children. In July, we took the whole school to the cinema to see Aladdin following our production of 'Aladdin Trouble'. It was the PTFA who provided snack boxes for all the children. We are so grateful to our small dedicated team of parents who organise the PTFA fund-raising. It would be lovely to see more parents get involved and support this important work which benefits all our children. Please speak to your class representative (see notices) if you are able to help in anyway at all.

Thank you to all parents for attending the consultations last week. It is by working together in this way that we are able to ensure your child makes the best possible progress in school. It was also lovely to receive such positive feedback via the parental questionnaires.

In Orchard year 2 maths, we have been comparing length, capacity and mass. We visited different tables in the classroom to sort a variety of objects from least to greatest. Impressively, we all used our mathematical vocabulary to explain how we knew how to order them.






In Orchard year 3 maths we have been learning about place value, we have been using the variety of very useful manipulatives to create concrete representations of different numbers.

Haffydown Class

This week in maths we have been looking at multiplicative reasoning. We played this game in pairs. We built an array and then hid some from our partner with the paper. We had to make sure that we left the number of rows on display and how many were in one of the rows. Our partner then had to use this information to calculate how many cubes there must be altogether using their fact recall or counting strategies.





Danes Class



Last week, we enjoyed an art day. During the morning we learned about the life and works of Cezanne. We even learned to recognise his distinctive style so that we were able to identify which were his paintings when given a selection of work by Cezanne and Monet. Next, we learnt and used a wide range of art vocabulary to describe one of Cezanne's paintings in detail. In the afternoon, we used watercolour paints and practised painting backgrounds (sky) and foregrounds (trees). Later in the term, we will be painting watercolour landscapes – first of all linked to our learning about the world wars and then linked to out geographical study of the British Isles.
