After just over three weeks back in school, it is great to see the progress that the children are making already. There is a real 'buzz' of learning around the school and it is great to see how quickly the children (and staff) have adapted to all the new routines. The whole staff team have been working incredibly hard to ensure we remain Covid-safe through regular cleaning of surfaces and equipment, supervision of children whilst they eat lunches in classrooms (KS2), enjoy distanced playtimes etc. Access from the school site via the one-way system has been improved by the installation of an additional gate into the car park. Thank you for your patience and support as we adapt and adjust to the 'new normal'.

Whilst we work hard in school to keep our community as safe as possible, it would be unrealistic to think that our school will be unaffected by the recent increase in cases; already several Hertfordshire schools have had to close to certain 'bubbles' for fourteen days. Should we find ourselves in this position in the future, then online home learning would resume using Seesaw and Tapestry - as it did in the summer term. Please make sure you keep your child's login details safe.

We hope that all our families will continue to follow current government rules in order to keep everyone as safe as possible. It is also important for the children to understand that everyone needs to work together and follow the rules if we are to avoid further restrictions and loss of life.

Peartree Class






We have been having a lot of fun in our learning. We have been making models of houses and recreated a street scene from The Great Fire of 1666. In maths we have been investigating numbers and have used mathematical models and everyday objects to show representations of them. In RE we are looking at creation and how Christians believed God made the world. As we enter into the season of Autumn we are learning about the changes that happen in nature and the changes we make to adjust to the different weather. We are also enjoying playing in our outside area.









Orchard Class



We have really enjoyed our learning in Orchard Class this week.

In English, we have been learning about traditional tales. All of our learning has been around the story of Little Red Riding Hood, and other versions of this traditional tale. We have been writing the story, as well as writing character and setting descriptions and comparing different versions of the story.

We have also been very interested in our new History topic about Joseph Lancaster. We have been learning about how the children in Hitchin used to live and we were surprised to find out how different it is to how children live now!

In RE, we have been learning about Diwali, the Hindu festival of light. We have been creating Rangoli patterns and diva lamps to experience how Hindus celebrate this festival. We loved making our diva lamps.

We have been enjoying our Maths, too. We have been learning about place value and using the tens and ones equipment and bead strings to help us with our learning.

We are looking forward to lots more exciting learning in our different lessons!









Haffydown Class



It has been a very busy first two weeks back in Haffydown and we have learnt so much already!

During our Maths lessons, we have been busy "reactivating" our prior knowledge and exploring place value of 2, 3 and 4 digit numbers. We have been representing numbers in different ways such as using dienes, digits, words and pictorially. We loved playing "Bankers Game" to help with our regrouping.

Our English text "Stone Age Boy", has inspired us to start planning and writing own time travel stories. We spent a lesson using role play to explore what it feels like when two characters cannot understand each other. We had to rely on hand gestures, noises and facial expressions. We have also been learning about the different techniques the author uses to create suspense and will try to use them in our own stories.






In Science, Year 4 have been exploring the digestive system and the job of the different organs. We now know how all the organs work together like a machine to help us break down and digest our food.

We have loved getting stuck into our Stone Age to Iron Age topic in history. Many children have been bringing in some fabulous home learning already such as these amazing models of Stone Henge. Later in the term, we will be investigating the mystery of Stone Henge and why it is there.



Danes Class

Danes class really have been very busy over the past couple of weeks and are already making great progress in their learning. In English, we are studying the novel 'Pig Heart Boy'; this has prompted much debate about the pros and cons of organ transplants – in particular xenotransplantation (not only do the children understand what this means, but many of them can also spell it!). Last Friday, they wrote some amazing persuasive arguments and this week they have taken part in a formal debate before writing a discussion text. This also allowed us to learn about how democracy works as we learnt about how issues are debated in Parliament.



In maths, we have been extending our understanding of place value to include very large numbers and decimals. We have enjoyed playing lots of games with dice and playing cards to help us to secure our understanding and develop our fluency. Regular work on Times Tables Rock Stars is helping the children to improve their studio speed and training level.



Learning is science this half term is all about forces. We have been using Newton meters and learnt all about the difference between weight, mass and gravity. We have been very impressed that some children have already bought in home learning projects to support their learning.







Our historical focus this term is Ancient Egypt; it's amazing how much the children know already. Last week, we located Egypt on world maps and then developed our atlas skills in order to make deductions about what the country is like. Once again, we are enjoying sharing the fantastic home

learning projects.
