Art: Circles - Kandinsky

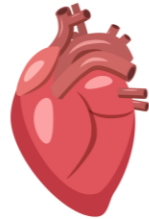
PE: Cricket, Athletics, Swimming

Equipment

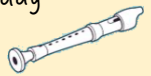
PE Kit: PE lessons will take place on Mondays and Fridays. Please ensure appropriate kits are in school and items clearly labelled. Trainers will be needed EVERY DAY for the 'Daily Mile'.



Water bottles: It is essential that all children bring a named water bottle into school each day and take it home to be washed daily. They will keep these next to their table for use throughout the day.



Recorders: please make sure these are in school every Tuesday

Home Learning Expectations

A key focus in upper Key Stage Two is to ensure children are prepared as fully as possible for transition to secondary school. With this in mind, regular homework is on different days with the expectation that all children organise their time to ensure that tasks are completed and submitted on time. Children should be encouraged to be as independent as possible in terms of organising themselves and ensuring all tasks are completed on time (though it is absolutely fine to support your child with their learning as appropriate).
