We read 'Not a box' by Antoinette Portis and 'What to do with a Box' by Jane Yolen and Chris Sheban as inspiration for the things you can make and do with a cardboard box. Our classroom was full of boxes and other materials so that our imaginations could run wild! We used a lot of our skills such as planning, designing, cutting, joining and decorating to make our creations. We all worked very hard and we're proud of our creations. We had an exhibition at the end of the week for our families.











Peartree Class

It has been a really busy half term which has gone so quickly. In our English lessons, we finally completed our extended writing task and have produced our own books. We even had a drawing lesson from the author himself (YouTube).

Our bean plants, which we planted in week one, now are ready for us to take home. Unfortunately, three of our plants did not grow but Mrs Baker has given these children some flowers to plant in their garden which will come by late summer.

We have been doing some commemorative work this week in honour of the Queen's Jubilee. We sketched the Queen's portrait and are now painting them. We also have written a letter to the Queen which we are going to post.

Orchard Class


We love looking at maps in Orchard! To start off our Hot and Cold Places Geography unit, we started by looking at the seven different continents and five world oceans in our atlases and on our globes. We love singing the continents song to help us remember this important sticky knowledge! You can singalong at home too! https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=K6DSMZ8b3LE Over the next few weeks, we will be exploring how the climate can be different in the different countries and how this can affect the plants, animals and the way in which people live. I have been very impressed with the lovely hot and cold collages that children have been bringing in for their home learning as well as impressive research of different countries.







To finish off our science unit on plants, we designed these fabulous posters for The Eden Project. Orchard were very interested to find out about how these greenhouse biomes enable tropical plants to grow in the hot and humid conditions.







Haffydown Class

In English, we have started our new unit on playscripts. We have been comparing playscripts to narrative, especially how dialogue is represented. We began by reading *Alice in Wonderland*. Year Three followed the stage directions to perform The Mad Tea Party scene. We had some very convincing sleepy dormice! We have also turned a very funny poem, *ABC* by Spike Milligan, into a playscript to perform. We thought this poem was very clever.













We have been multiplying multiples of ten this week. We started the unit by measuring human items so we could make them 10 times bigger - for a giant! We measured, cutlery, our feet and hands, strides, the classroom and cups of water. We discovered the giant's items, body and drinks would be very big! We continued our learning by multiplying multiples of ten by using our base ten equipment, place value sliders and findings base facts.


In science, we have continued our learning about rocks and soils. We learnt about fossil formation. We focused on trace fossils (footprints, trackways and coprolites) and body fossils (mould and cast). We then organised stages of the formation of a fossil and role played this. We had some roar-some dinosaurs. To reinforce this learning, we are making our own fossils.

Puddlebridge Class

Puddlebridge Class have recently finished our poetry unit based on 'The Lost Words'. We ended the unit by writing our own poetry inspired by the book, making sure we included alliteration, kennings, and metaphors to help the reader to visualise each British animal.



Year 4 have been working very hard in Science, observing different insects in order to further understand their characteristics. Just have a look at the impressive large-scale drawings they created as a group!



Danes Class



Last week, Year Six completed their Bikeability training. Their first morning was spent practising their skills on the school playground and then, after that, they were out on the roads each day in order to complete their Level 2 training. During the course, the children learnt: to start and stop with confidence; to pass stationary vehicles parked on a road; to understand signals, signs and road markings; to negotiate the road (including quiet junctions, crossroads and roundabouts) and to share the road with other vehicles. The children really enjoyed the training and are now well-prepared to keep themselves safe when riding their bikes.

Well done Year Six!

This week, we have begun our textiles project. We will be designing and making our own cushions. To practise our skills, we have made some Jubilee bunting. We are becoming experts on the sewing machine as well as sewing on buttons and using different embroidery stitches.


