Home Learning

The arrangements for home learning in Danes class are changing slightly this term. Our aims are to:

- ensure that the Year 6 children are prepared as fully as possible for their tests in May
- to establish good routines before their move to secondary school.

By setting different homework tasks on different days and asking for work to be handed in at different times, we hope that the children will get used to planning their time carefully and organising themselves to have the appropriate tasks completed by different deadlines.

The table outlines the new arrangements for weekly homework.

Home Learning projects will continue to be set half-termly (see separate sheet) – these are <u>optional for Year 6</u> this term to allow for the additional demands outlined above. Key Stage 2 Tests

Year 6 children will be taking their SATs tests between

Tuesday 9th May – Friday 12th May.

Tests include: Reading, Maths (Arithmetic and Reasoning), Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling.

PE: PE will continue to take place on Mondays and Fridays. We will also continue with our daily mile, so it is important that trainers are in school every day.



Water Bottles

It is essential that all children bring a named water bottle into school each day and take it home to be washed daily. They keep these next to their table for use throughout the day.



Spring Term Curriculum

Our theme this term is 'Everybody's Earth' which includes an understanding of the Earth's resources, how these can be conserved and also trade with other countries. This links well with our science topic 'Earth in Space'. These themes will include work across many areas of the curriculum with a particular focus on geographical and scientific knowledge and skills. We will also be linking our learning in Art, DT and MfL (French) with these themes.

Later in the term, we will move onto a history topic called 'Thomas Clarkson and the Transatlantic Slave Trade'. Thomas Clarkson was a leading campaigner against the slave trade and has local links – in fact, there is a memorial to him just a few miles from school at Wadesmill.

English: We will begin the term by focussing on Mystery and Suspense writing inspired by the books 'The Watertower' and 'Boy in the Tower'.

Maths: Our learning will include securing arithmetic skills, algebra, fractions, decimals and percentages, ratio and proportion, 2D and 3D shape and angles.

Science: Earth in Space then Properties and Changes of Materials

History: Thomas Clarkson and the Transatlantic Slave Trade

Geography: Everybody's Earth

RE: How far would a Sikh go for his/her religion? What did Jesus do to save human beings?

Art: Abstract art inspired by the work of Peter Thorpe

DT: Moon Buggies/Mars Rovers

Music: Journey into Space. Composers: Prokofiev, Beethoven

PSHE: Safety First then Drugs Education

MfL: The Planets then The Weekend

Computing: Blogging and text Adventures

PE: Gymnastics, Dance and Orienteering
