Performance Reading Progression

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Reading at Aston St. Mary's

Reading is a key priority at Aston St. Mary's. Children begin to learn phonics as soon as they enter their Reception year. We follow the Little Wandle phonics programme which enables the children to make rapid progress and quickly gain reading fluency. Children are taught to read throughout the school during reading practice (or guided reading) sessions three times a week. These follow a similar structure throughout the school where the first session focuses on decoding and vocabulary, the second on prosody (reading in a 'performance voice') and the third session on comprehension of the text. Without a doubt, children at Aston St. Mary's love books and to read! We have a well-stocked library as well as reading corners within each classroom. We invest heavily in books in order to keep our stock current, relevant and engaging.


