

### A Thought from Reverend Jenny:

'Help us, dear Lord, to hold fast in truth... holding fast in truth means accepting Jesus is 'the Way, the Truth and the Life', (John 14:6) and following his teaching and example.

"You are a King then!" said Pilate. Jesus answered, "You are right in saying I am a King. In fact, for this reason I was born, and for this I came into the world to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to me. 'What is truth?' Pilate asked (John 18:37-38).

Pilate's question, 'what is truth?' echoes down the ages. Was it a real desire to know? a cynical insult? or an irritated response to Jesus?...

The Postmodern world denies truth can be known. Relativism says there's no such thing as absolute truth – what's true for one situation is not necessarily true for others – truth is relative to the circumstances.

Pluralism says that all truth claims are equally valid. But truth is not whatever works – that's pragmatism. Not what makes people feel good - bad news can be true. Not what the majority says is true – a lie believed is still a lie.

The Greek word for "truth" means "hiding nothing." The Hebrew word for "truth" means "firmness," "constancy" and "durable." The word 'truth is found more than 200 times in scripture - truth is the way things really are, what we see in Jesus, 'the Way, the Truth and the Life' (John 14:6)

### **Shackadell Class Fundraising to Support Paradise Wildlife Park**

After Shackadell's recent trip to Paradise Wildlife Park, and alongside our curriculum ambition of organising a fundraising event, the children chose to raise money for the animals. The children took part in a sponsored animal run to raise funds for the conservation projects and to buy particular equipment for the park. During this, the children climbed on the trim trail like white cheeked gibbons; crawled and stood like the meercats; waddled like the African penguins; slithered like the green anaconda; walked on all fours like a sun bear; flapped and swooped like barn owls; jumped like a red-necked wallaby and sprinted like the jaguar. Afterwards, they were very tired and played sleeping lions! Their hard work paid off as they were able to raise £102.50. They spent time choosing items from the Paradise Park Amazon 'wish list' such as foraging toys for the monkeys and sugar cane for the sun bears. They were really proud of themselves, and we are proud of them too!

#### **Parenting When Separated Programme**

The Parenting When Separated Programme is a practical and positive evidence-based course for parents who are preparing for, going through, or have gone through a separation or divorce.

It is a six-week course that highlights practical steps parents can take to help their children cope and thrive, as well as coping successfully themselves.

#### Topics include:

- Solving co-parenting problems in a positive way that focus on the needs of children.
- Coping with the emotional impact of separation and learning stress management techniques.
- Helping your children cope with the impact of the separation both emotionally and practically.
- Enhancing communication with their children and with their children's other parent.

The course is free to attend and is open to separated parents from all backgrounds. Both mothers and fathers, resident and non-resident parents. Both parents of the same children are welcome to attend though we recommend you attend separate groups.
