



CURRICULUM



In **Geography and History** this term, we will complete our learning about '**Rivers**' and then move onto our historical learning about '**Ancient Greece'**. Our work will also link to other curriculum areas.

English: Texts will include Arthur Spiderwick's Field Guide, A Midsummer Nights Dream and poetry.

Maths: Year Six revision in preparation for SATs. Proportional and Statistical Reasoning, Circles, Measures, Pattern and Arithmetic.

Science: The Human Circulatory System and Classification of Living Things (including Microorganisms).

French: Olympics and Irregular Verbs.

Computing: Excel Spreadsheets.

RE: What would Jesus do? Does belief in Akhirah (life after death) help Muslims lead good lives?

Music: Preparation for Summer production. Recorders and 'Who Knows' unit.

PSHE: Living in the Wider World 'One World' and 'Respecting Rights'.
